

COVID Waiver – Pavilions 2021

- The Responsible Parties will assume all responsibility that everyone present at the event adhere to all state mandated social distancing guidelines, maintaining a 6 foot distance between individuals/small groups. All patrons should wear masks in situations when social distancing of 6 ft. cannot be maintained. Tightly confined spaces should be occupied by only one individual at a time, unless all occupants are wearing a mask. Children under the age of 2 do not have to wear a mask.
- The Responsible Parties must supply masks to guests who do not have one. Caterer is responsible for providing them to their staff.
- Parks staff will set up tables to comply with social distancing guidelines, both under and around the shelter or inside reserved buildings. Tables will be placed a minimum of 7 ft. apart. Tables are not to be moved without staff approval. Limit tables to "family" groups as much as possible.
- The Responsible Parties will provide contact information for any guests/staff for contact tracing purposes, if necessary.
- Limiting number of guests at the reserved location to the state mandated current capacity allowed.
- Non-compliance with all of the stated regulations on the day of the event may result in immediate cancellation of the event with no refund.
- These guidelines could all change at any time or we may be directed to cancel your event. If there are any changes, we will reach out to you as soon as possible.
- Prices will not be discounted.
- The responsible person will collect all names and phone numbers for contact tracing purposes. This must be turned into the park attendant at time of check out.
- To reduce the amount the risk of exposure, between guests and the park attendants, please pull your own trash and place behind/to the side of the building. The park attendants will be around, periodically, to grab them. Extra bags will be given to the party during check-in.
